#### Science Forum South Africa 2025

- o 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary
- An open, free to attend, forum to ignite conversations about science
- Open to South Africans, Africans and International participants as speakers, presenters, facilitators, exhibitors and attendees
- o Between 3 000 and 4 000 attendees per year

#### World Conference of Science Journalists

- The first edition of the World Conference was organized in Tokyo in 1992; while the World Federation of Science Journalists was created ten years later in 2002 during the third WCSJ in Brazil.
- The main goals of the Federation and the Conference are to improve the quality of science reporting, promote standards, support science and technology journalists and to build a community of science journalists globally.
- For 2025 the goal of the Local Organising Committee is also to achieve these objectives for South Africa and the African continent.
